Developed by the **Association of Protecting Exotic Species CIC**, the platform supports responsible ownership, high welfare standards, conservation outcomes, and legislative compliance nationwide.

APES CareBase was formerly known as APES NED (National Exotics Database).

The name has been updated to reflect the expanded scope of the platform, which now holds and manages information beyond exotic species alone, encompassing a wider range of animals, care settings, and professional use cases.

Why a National Care Database?

A centralised care database supports population monitoring, traceability, and continuity of care. It assists with enforcement of relevant legislation, improves information sharing, and helps ensure animals receive appropriate husbandry and veterinary attention throughout their lives.

Using the Database

How to Register an Animal

Follow the step-by-step process to create or update an animal's record. Registration supports accurate record-keeping for welfare monitoring, public safety, and long-term care planning.

Searching the Database

Search by species, location, or registration number to access animal records, care guidance, and relevant documentation where available.

Reporting Concerns

Use the platform to report lost or found animals, suspected illegal activity, or welfare concerns. Reports may be reviewed and, where appropriate, shared with relevant authorities.

Legal & Welfare Resources

Legal Requirements

Access current information on UK legislation relating to animal ownership, breeding, transport, sale, and trade.

Welfare Guidelines

Consult best-practice guidance informed by experienced professionals, covering housing, nutrition, enrichment, health monitoring, and veterinary care. Where evidence is limited or evolving, this is clearly indicated.
